

VA Healthcare New Multi-Specialty Clinic in Vero Beach

Aug 27, 2025

VA's new multi-specialty clinic in Vero Beach, located at the Indian River VA Clinic (777 37th Street), is undergoing construction and will open in phases, with initial services expected in **March 2026 and full activation anticipated by May 2026**. This 20,000-square-foot facility will offer specialty services like audiology, cardiology, dermatology, dental, and physical therapy, while primary care services will remain at the existing 17th Street location.

I will try to keep everyone updated on the progress as I learn about it.

For Veterans Day 2025, many restaurants are expected to offer free meals or special discounts to active-duty military members and veterans, with a military ID or proof of service required. Here is a small list of Restaurant Freebies and Deals to Look For, there are many more, check your local listings for other ones.

Applebees: Free meals from a select menu are often offered to veterans and active-duty military.

Bob Evans: A special free menu for veterans is a common offering.

Chick-fil-A: Participating locations sometimes offer a free chicken sandwich to active-duty personnel and veterans with valid ID.

Chilis: A free meal from a select menu is a frequent Veterans Day special for military members.

Dennys: A free breakfast offer is a possibility.

Golden Corral: A free thank-you meal is often provided for veterans.

IHOP: Free pancake combos are a recurring Veterans Day deal.

Olive Garden: Veterans and active-duty military typically receive a free entrée from a special menu.

Panera Bread: Free breakfast items and coffee are sometimes available at participating locations.

Texas Roadhouse: A complimentary lunch is a tradition at many locations.

Saint Lucie Flag Retirement Box Program—a respectful, community-driven initiative for retiring worn or tattered U.S. flags with dignity. The Flag Retirement Box Program offers residents a respectful way to retire worn American flags.
